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# The Book

What is a Lamentation?

“The passionate or demonstrative expression of grief; mourning”

Oxford's English Dictionary

# How did the Book Get its Title?

- Hebrew: *ekah* - “How...!” exclamation of grief...
- Greek: *threni* - “Lament; wail”
- Latin: *Lamentationes* - “Lamentations”

# Who Wrote It?

Jeremiah?

“Jeremiah composed laments for Josiah, and to this day all the men and women singers commemorate Josiah in the laments. These became a tradition in Israel and are written in the Laments.”

2 Chron. 35:25

# When Was It Written?

- Post 587 B.C.
- Eyewitness

*My eyes fail from weeping... (11)*

*Infants lives ebb away in their mother's arms*

*Young and old lie together in the streets ... fallen  
by the sword (21)*

- Pre 538 B.C.



# Uniqueness of Book

## ■ Genre of Literature

The great storm howls above... In front of the storm fires burn; the people groan... In its boulevards, where the feasts were celebrated, scattered they lay...the people lay in heaps... "Alas for my city...alas for my house..." Lamentation over the destruction of Ur, Sumer (2000 B.C.)

# Day Three

- 22 Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. 23 They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. 24 I say to myself, "The LORD is my portion; therefore I will wait for him." 25 The LORD is good to those whose hope is in him, to the one who seeks him; 26 it is good to wait quietly for the salvation of the LORD . 27 It is good for a man to bear the yoke while he is young. 28 Let him sit alone in silence, for the LORD has laid it on him. 29 Let him bury his face in the dust- there may yet be hope.
