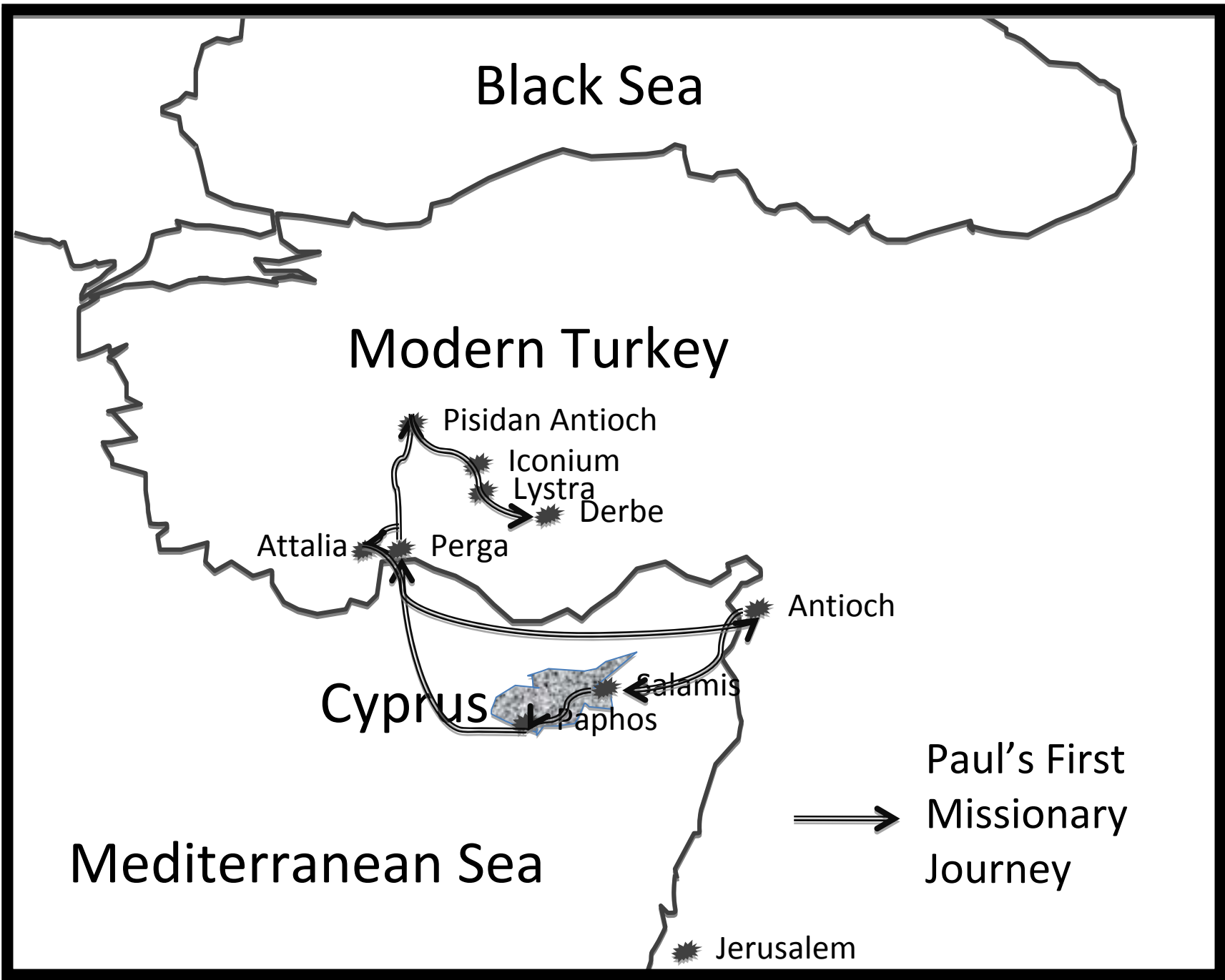
Why does Mark leave?
