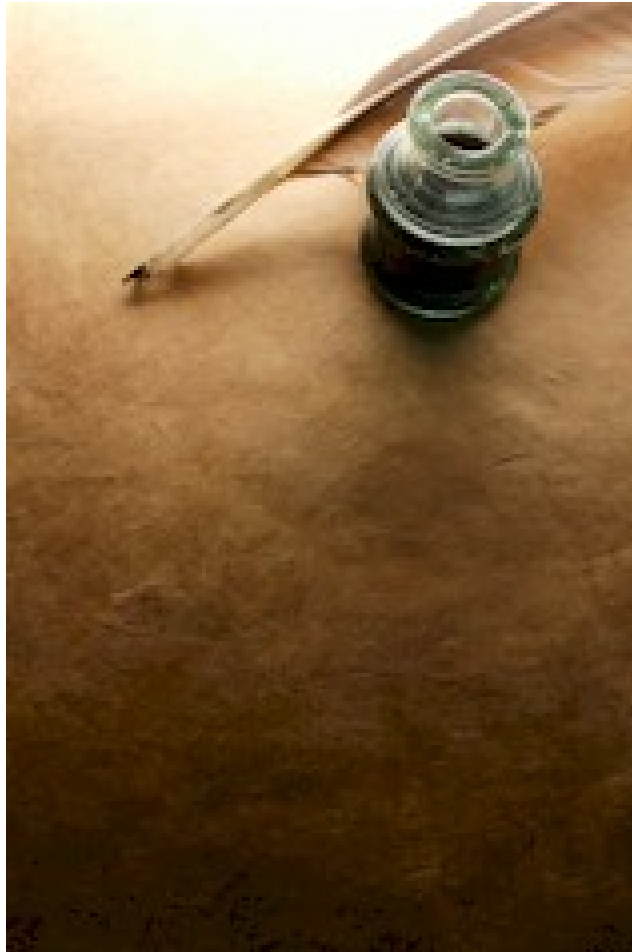

Remember the Philippian jailor



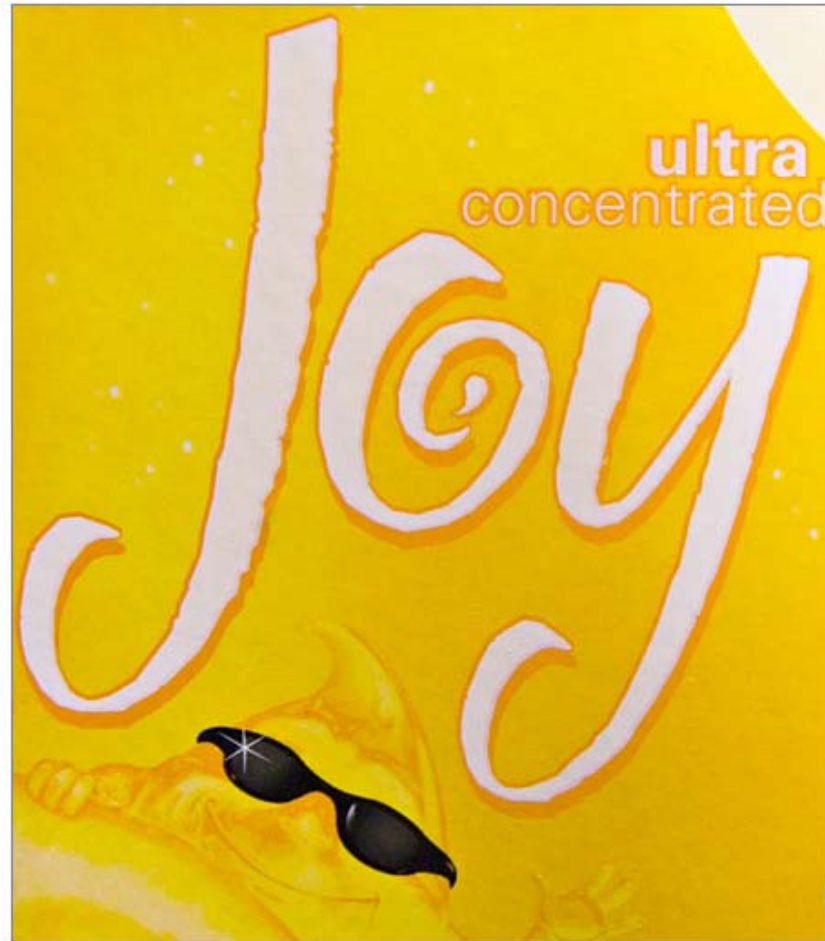
Luke was tied closely to Philippi

Paul's confidence in God's work



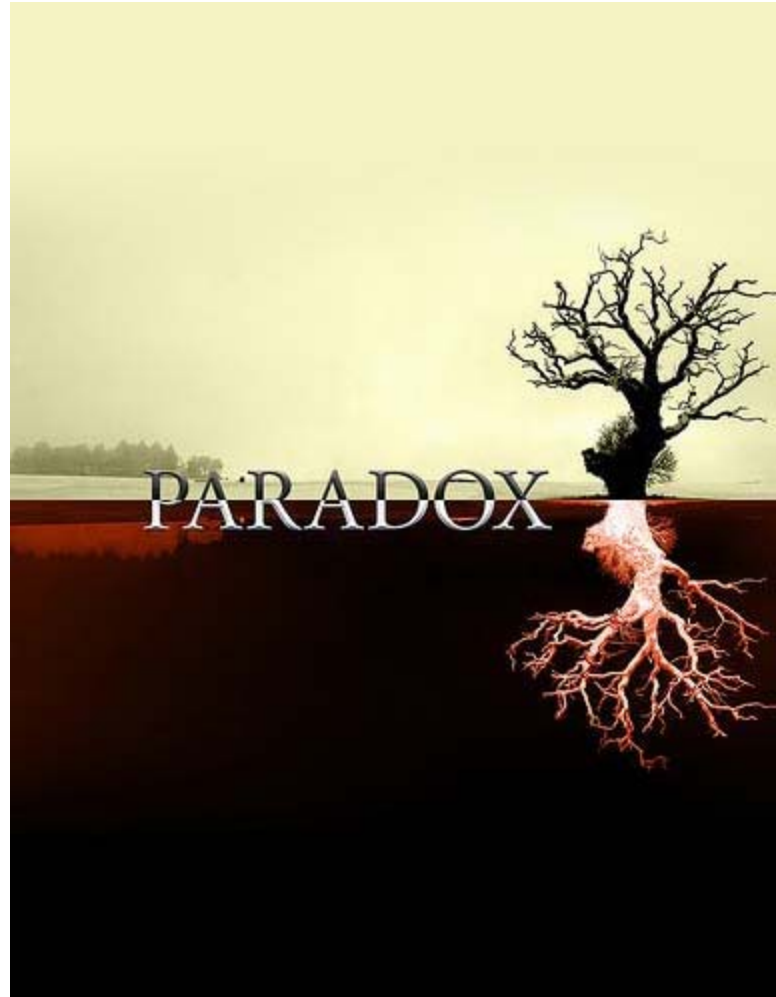
Paul's imprisonment was for the good

Work out what God is working in



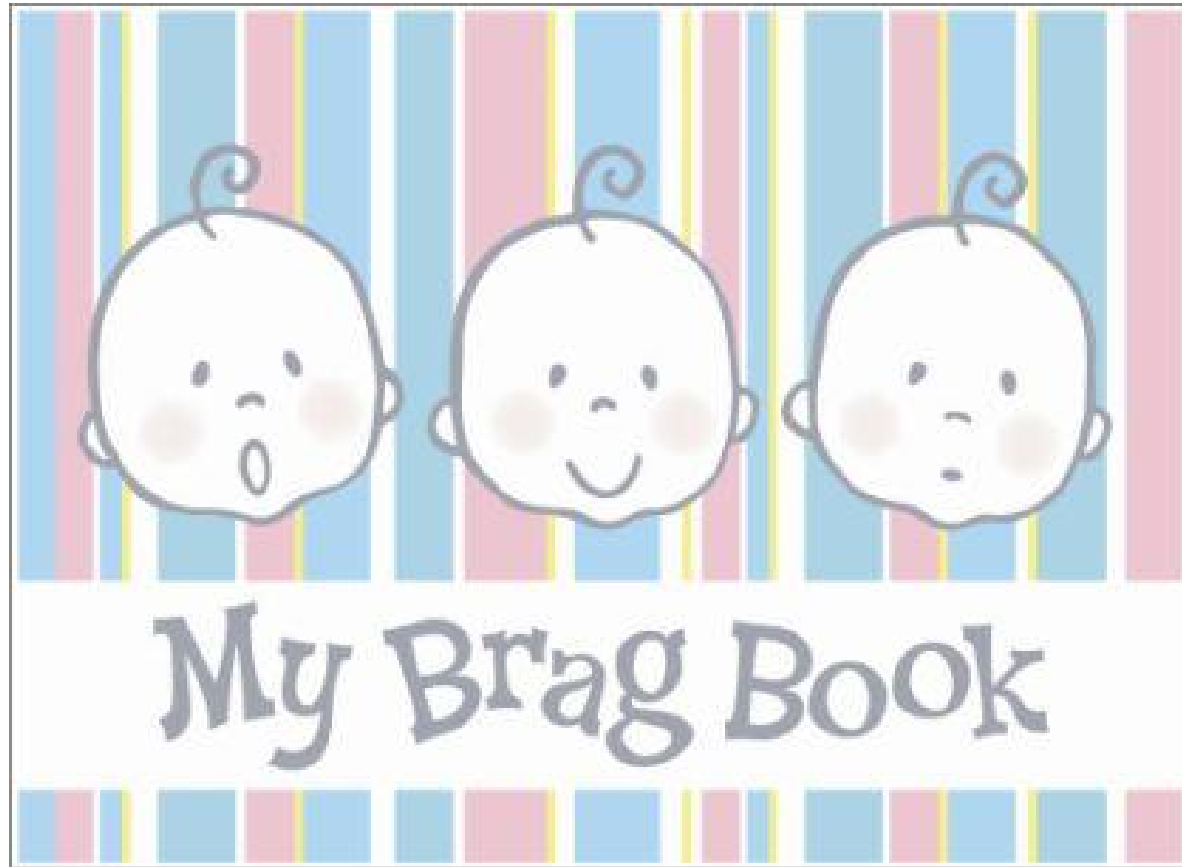

in God and his supply

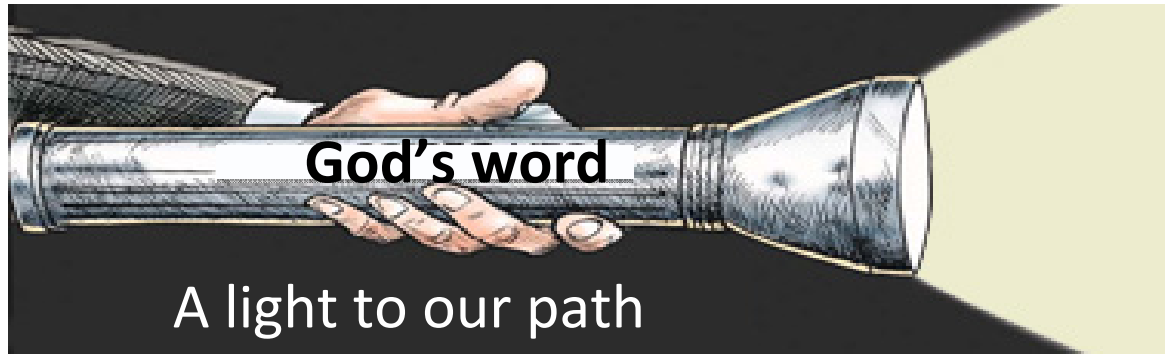
